## **Policy Specific Moods Codebook**

The policy specific moods data set was created to supplement the traditional Global Mood measure<sup>1</sup> in an effort to provide scholars with as many policy specific mood measures as possible.<sup>2</sup> We disaggregated the global mood database, which consists of nearly 400 survey questions and almost 8,000 administrations across 70 years, and generated longitudinal measures of public opinion in specific policy domains. By matching each survey item with a policy code from the Policy Agendas Project coding scheme, we were able to estimate 61 unique series. We estimate five additional series relating to abortion and gay rights which can be found at the end of the series section.

#### Variable Names and Descriptions

- KeyID: This column records the unique identifier for each observation. It has no substantive application.
- Topic: This column denotes the Policy Agendas Projects subtopic code that corresponds to the survey items included in this observation. The codes and examples for this column are found in the Major Topics Codebook on the Policy Agendas Project website.
- Year: This column represents the year of the particular estimate.
- Mood: This column displays the policy-specific mood that corresponds to the Topic.

#### **Description of Individual Mood Series**

For each series estimated, we provide information regarding the number of survey items used in that estimate, the total number of administrations of each survey item and the represented time period.

- Question Series: the number of unique survey items used in the policy specific mood
- Total Administrations: the number of times the question series were administered to the public
- Period: the time frame of the policy specific mood series

#### Table Variable Names for Individual Mood Series

We also provide diagnostic information for each question series in each policy specific mood estimate.

- Series: the unique identifier for each survey item in the database. The full question wording for each survey item can be found in the last section of this codebook
- Cases: the number of times a particular survey item was administered
- Loading: the item loading in the policy specific mood estimate (see Stimson 1991 for more detail)
- Mean: the average response (liberal response/(conservative response + liberal response)) across all administrations
- SD: the standard deviation of the responses
